February is the month that begins the Billiard Club Annual Championships. This competition is a chance for club members to see if they are the top contender in their category. Remember, championship participants can only compete in one of the event categories with the exception of the Ladies Division who can compete in two. Masters players must only compete in the Masters Division. Player participants can only compete in the Players Division.

This Championship event commenced with the women's competition on February 19th. 13 Women competed in the Women's Club Championship in a double elimination tournament. This was the largest turnout we have had for many years. Joyce Miller was undefeated at the end of the day. Joyce will face Gayle Anderson who won a playoff contest that was held on February 28th.

The final match for this event will be played on Championship Saturday, March 12th at 9am along with the other club finals.

Unfortunately, the novice tournament was not held this year due to a low turnout. Hopefully we will be able to hold this tournament in 2023.

In preparation for next month's prestigious Brieseth Cup event, the cup team captains have been selected. Team USA's captain is Rob Pulvino and Team Canada's is Richard Wear. The remainder of Cup team members were and will be selected in the following processes described next.

On Saturday, February 26th, the qualifying event for spots on the Briesath Cup teams for USA and Canada was held. All billiard club members were invited to participate and we had a number of club players hoping to make the team. **The qualifying winners were: Team USA Linda Asleson Team Canada Brian Pin**

The remaining three Briesath cup team members will be selected by the following:

- 1. Top finishers in the Masters tournament
- 2. One each team captains pick
- 3. One selection each team by Briesath Cup committee members. Also, an alternate player will be selected for each team.

The Briesath Cup committee is composed of: Doug Asleson, Scott Kovac, and Paul Ertman. These selections will be made on or after the Masters Tournament on March 4th. That rounds out the selection process of the 5 team members of each Brieseth Cup team.



The Billiards Club Championship competition continues in March. The Players Championship will take place on March 3rd at 8:00 AM and the corresponding Masters Championship takes place on March 4th at 8:00 AM. In the event there is an overflow event required for the club championships, that will be held on March 5th.

The next notable club event of the spring season is the Billiard Club Spring Luncheon on March 7th. The location of this event has changed from previous years. This year it will be held in the Sagebrush Ballroom located in the Sonoran Plaza. Lunch will be served starting at 12:30 PM. Members are free but member's guests will be charged \$15. Babbo's restaurant is catering the event. All club members are required to have signed up and all guests must be prepaid in order to attend. Club members are also required to wear name badges.

Next, our top premier club event of the spring season will be Championship Saturday on March 12th. That day will consist of the Billiard Club Championships, the Pot Luck, and finally the Briesath Cup Championship. The club is requiring members who want to attend the Pot Luck to sign the Sign-Up sheet posted in the Pool Room. The Club will be providing sandwiches at the Pot Luck and thus a count is needed to determine the number people that will be attending.
