Continuing with Jerry's numerous pool accomplishments, the Billiard Club hosted a Party to Honor his being elected to the BCA Billiards Hall of Fame. This event was held on Saturday July 30th, 2022 in the Apache Room. The club supplied the main meal and volunteers brought a side dish, salad or dessert. All that attended had a great time.

The club's summer social agenda continued with a "Fun Social Night" that was held on Monday, August 15th 2022. It was held in the Billiards Room and adjacent Apache Room. The event consisted of both competitive billiard challenges and meal consisting of pizza, salad, snacks, coffee and desert, plus a cash bar. There was a Challenge Entry fee of \$3 per person which was applied to cash prizes.



If you have been in the billiard room lately, you may have noticed the Club Members Challenge Boards located near Jerry Briesath's picture. The club would like to have its members challenge each other in their perspective skill level to test their level of play. Rob Pulvino started to develop and finalize the challenge board concept over the past several months. Thanks, Rob for putting this challenge board together. Please read the challenge rules on the billiard room bulletin board to understand how this challenge process works. To make

the challenge concept more interesting, we have made the following change. You may now challenge anyone up to 3 players above you on the board. This includes the number 1 player.

When a participant challenges someone, that individual can choose one of the following options:

The Masters challenger can pick any game of 1 pocket, 8,9,10 ball, and straight pool (first to reach 100) to challenge the person above them.

The Players can select from 8, 9, or 10 ball to challenge, race to 5.

Ladies, 8 ball race to 3 only.

Novice, 8 ball (ball in hand) race to 3 only.

A memorable note about one of our own, Jerry Briesath. Following is an article from USBMA.

The Billiard Congress of America (BCA) Hall of Fame will welcome a world champion and one of the game's most revered teachers to the Hall of Fame Class of 2022. The United States Billiard Media Association (USBMA) today announced that Filipino star Dennis Orcollo and legendary instructor Jerry Briesath have earned induction into the sport's most prestigious club.

Orcollo, 43, was the clear choice of voters in the Greatest Players category and will be the fourth player representing the Philippines to be inducted into the BCA Hall of Fame, joining legends Efren Reyes, Francisco Bustamante and Jose Parica.



Briesath, 85, was a unanimous selection in the Meritorious Service category. The longtime and legendary instructor is considered the father of formal billiard instruction in America, having helped develop and guide the program from concept to its current roster of more than 300 professional instructors across the globe.

For Briesath, an active pro player in the 1960's and '70s, the award is validation of years of service to players and the sport. "This is just super," Briesath said. "The Hall of Fame is about having the admiration of people in the sport and in the industry for what you've done."

I've been to almost all of the Hall of Fame banquets and it was always wonderful to see great players and good people get recognized." A longtime poolroom owner in Madison, Wis., Briesath helped launch the BCA Certified Instructor Program (now known as the Professional Billiard Instructors Association) in 1992 and the BCA Summer Youth Cue Camps in 1993. He was

awarded the BCA President's Award in 1997 for his ongoing efforts to improve how players learn to play. He later helped create the BCA "How to Play Pool Right" book and video.

Orcollo and Briesath will formally be inducted into the Hall of Fame on Friday, Nov. 4, at the Norfolk Sheraton Waterside Hotel in Norfolk, Va., in conjunction with the 2022 International Open pool tournament.

Changing the subject, with the approaching of fall, it will soon be time for the annual Billiard Club Board Elections. At our last Annual Membership Meeting, it was voted that officers would be elected for a 2-year term, so our Vice President and Treasurer have one more year to serve. Thus, the board elections this year

will be for President and Secretary, both with 2-year terms. In addition, all 5 Directors will be up for election with 1 year terms. There's a sign-up sheet currently in the Billiards room for those of you who are interested and willing to be of service on the board for the upcoming year of 2023! The election will conclude on December 19th. Details to follow.

The next important event for our club members to remember is the Club Annual Membership meeting. This meeting is scheduled for November 7th at 1:00PM in the Palm room. 
