#### 2023 – 2024 League Information

Moving on from the Club's summer league activity, our Fall Season is arriving soon for our leagues. Our club wants to provide an opportunity for interested players to participate and enjoy league play. **Signup sheets for all leagues were posted in the pool room and needed to be completed by October 31st AM.** So, if you didn't sign up and your reading about this now, unfortunately, you are too late. On the afternoon of October 31st, the league team members were picked. Team rosters will be posted November 1st. League playing times can be found on the Club website calendar.

It was decided that all leagues with the exception of the Travel League will have a two-session format. The first shorter session will be start in November and end in December. The second longer session will begin in January and end in March. League names have also been changed. The new league names and their respective league operators are as follows:

**Monday Night - Jim Janssens** This league is now open to all club members and has No Handicap. The league will consist of 4 teams. The league will start on Monday November  $6^{th}$ .

**Tuesday Night - Bruce Low** This league has a handicap. There will be 6 teams starting Tuesday November 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Wednesday Afternoon - Charly Fox** This league also has a handicap. The league will consist of 4 teams. The league will begin Wednesday November 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Friday Morning - Mike Garret** There is no handicap with this league. This league will have 3-4 teams and will start Friday November 10<sup>th</sup>.

If a league player is going to miss multiple weeks due to scheduled plans, we recommend for you to sign up for the Sub List instead.

All leagues will be comprised of up to 6 teams with a maximum of 30 total players. The team captains will select up to 5 team members per team. The number of players on a team will depend on the number of people that sign up for a particular league. If more than 30 people sign up for a specific league, anyone that is not picked will automatically be placed on the league Sub List. The Sub List for each league will be posted on the Bulletin Board. Club members have the opportunity to add their name to the posted Sub List any time during the League Season and are encouraged to do so.

The Club is considering creating a Ball-n-Hand Event starting on Thursday November 9<sup>th</sup>. In order to have a Ball-n-Hand event will depend on the number of people that signup.

#### **Travel League**

The Travel League will begin the 2024 season in January '24 to retain their current championship title.
