In addition to the 2024 Club officer and director announcements, three other important club items were addressed and voted upon. These items were:

- 1. The Club budget for 2024 was discussed. The board proposed three different budget options. After discussing the merits of the three, the attending Club members selected and then voted upon the one with the largest entertainment allocation.
- 2. The board proposed raising both the new member and existing member Club dues. The higher operating expenses the club has been experiencing were the justification for increasing the dues. After discussing the pros and cons of this issue, the meeting attendees voted to pass this resolution. For the 2025, new member dues will now be increased to \$30. This includes a new member name tag. For existing member renewal, the fee will now be \$20.
- 3. Club Board Member serving terms will now all be one year. Club members voted on this issue and approved it by 77 to 8.

Regarding the new increased dues, one of the attendees pointed out that even with the increased fees, what club members receive is a bargain. With the top-quality tables and balls, club tournaments, and social events the club provides far outstrips the nominal membership fee. I hope that all of you agree with these sentiments. I know I certainly do.

There were 51 Club members who attended this year's meeting. Looking back at last year's attendance, only 28 members attended that meeting. Combining the Club Annual Meeting and the Officer voting process into one meeting contributed to some of the increased attendance. In addition, the Club providing donuts and cookies probably didn't hurt either. However, this is still far fewer than the approximately 290 Club members. If members have issues or complaints about the Club or its operations, this meeting provides a forum to express your views and opinions. Attending this meeting is important.

Moving on to the Challenge Board. Following are the latest Challenge Board standings:

And remember, all the leagues are always looking for subs. You can sign up to become a sub at any time.


Travel League

Shot of the Month



One Rail Bank



Several years ago, I attended a pocket billiards presentation by Tom Rossman. He went over several fundamental pool shots and the One Rail Bank was one of them. Following the above diagram, I will review his technique to make this type of shot.

Imagine line BP is a cue with the tip at point B which is opposite the pocket you are trying to bank into. Move the D end of the cue to a point that is half the distance between OP or, OC = CP. Then parallel shift the cue to the point AO. Then strike the cue ball along this line, AO, to make the bank shot.

This bank shot procedure is very accurate. I must admit though, I usually look at a bank, visually use the old geometry adage, angle in equals angle out and make the shot. Since I only make this type of shot about half the time, it might be better for me to take the extra time and use Tom Rossman's bank shot method. The above bank shot method should be something that you might consider the next time you are in this situation.
