Most snowbird members have now returned to enjoy the sunny weather of Arizona. The cold weather is behind us. This is the time of the year that the Club and its members experience the most exciting times of the year. As you read this month's issue, I think you will agree that the month of March is not one to be missed as a Club Member. I don't want you sitting on the sidelines being a wall flower this month, get out and enjoy what the Billiards Club has to offer.



The first Club March event is "The Grand Billiard Club Luncheon". It will take place on March 3rd in the Sage Ballroom located in the Sonoran Plaza. Doors for this event will open at 12:00 and Lunch will be served at 1:00 PM. Babbo's will be catering our luncheon. There will be a Cash Bar for all members to enjoy. As with last year, Club Members are Free. However, there will be a \$20 charge for member guests. This fee can either be paid in advance or at the door the day of the luncheon.

The Club will be conducting two raffles at the Luncheon. They are as follows:

- **1.** A 50/50 split.
- **2.** A high quality Pechauer Cue, a (\$380 value). Each ticket will be \$10 and only 25 will be sold. If we have another 25 people, we will raffle another cue.

Again, please sign up on the sheets located in the Billiard Room. You will have a Great Time.

The next two Club events are the Club Championships and the Briesath Cup that each take place on Championship Saturday, March $23^{\rm rd}$. The qualifiers for these events are spread out over several days during the month of March.

The Briesath Cup captains for the two teams have been selected. Randy Biko and Randy Salzwedel will again captain the two teams. The remaining team members selection process will begin on Thursday, March 7th at 10 am with the Briesath Cup qualifying tournament. The sign-up sheet to compete was posted in the Billiard room on Sunday, February 18th. All Billiard Club members are eligible to compete in this event. There is no fee involved. The top two finishers will be on a Briesath Cup team!

Players will also be selected from the top two finishers of the Players Club Championship and the Masters Club Championship. The remaining four players will be "Captains Picks". Each Randy will get two picks. This will total two teams of six players each.

After the Briesath Cup Qualifier, the next significant Club Event are the Club Championship qualifiers. This competition is to select the two players for the finals. The competition dates are as follows:

Masters (double elimination)	Thursday	March 14	9 AM - 5 PM
Players (double elimination)	Friday	March 15	9 AM - 5 PM
Women (round robin)	Saturday	March 16	9 AM - 5 PM

As an incentive to increase women's participation in this year's tournament, the Club has initiated a few minor changes that women members may find appealing. Rather than the "bracket format" that caused a lot of down-time last year, we will instead use a "round robin format" which means each participant plays each other. The number of games played will be determined by how many participants we have that day. Playoff winners for the Women's Championship match will be the two women with the greatest number of wins on 3/16. These two women will then compete on Championship Saturday.

And Finally, the Culmination of the prior qualifier competitions is Championship Saturday which takes place on March 23rd. This is the day that the Club Championships, Championship Saturday Luncheon and the Briesath Cup, our premier Billiard Club event, take place. Event locations and times are as follows:

Shooting at an Object Ball Frozen to the Cushion

In looking back through some past Newsletters, I saw this rule that I thought might be of interest. When coming upon a frozen object ball to the cushion situation, there are some rules that the shooter should be aware of to avoid a foul. Review the following so you know how to address this situation.

When shooting at an Object Ball that is frozen, that is touching a cushion, the following must occur to avoid a foul. It is the opponent's responsibility to notify the shooter that there is an object ball that is frozen to the cushion. The players then need to agree that the object ball is actually touching the cushion. After the two players agree, the player that is up shoots the Cue Ball and it strikes the Object Ball.

The following must then happen:

- 1. The object Ball must either strike another cushion or be pocketed
- 2. The Cue ball must hit a cushion

If either of the two above options doesn't occur, the shooter incurs a foul. Then, Ball in Hand goes to your opponent.
